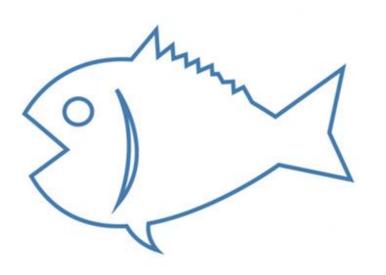

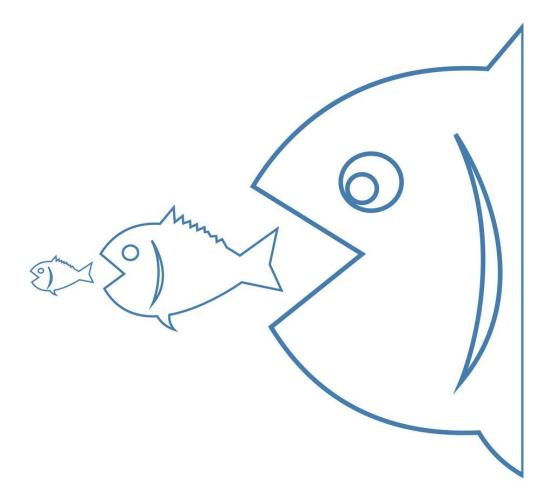

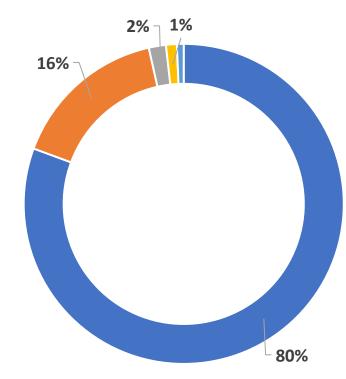

- Net Zero products

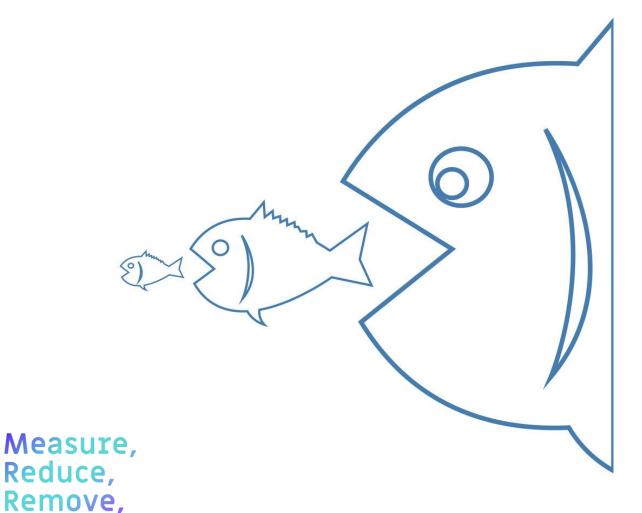
Customers
